Advice Letter No. 528-E

Bear Valley Electric Service, Inc. ("BVES") hereby transmits for filing the following:

SUBJECT: <u>New Housing Construction Service Connection Information for Rules 15 and 16 in Compliance with Senate Bill 1210</u>

PURPOSE

Senate Bill ("SB") 1210, signed into law on September 27, 2024, requires each utility to include additional information on their website to allow new housing construction applicants to view the schedule of estimated fees and the estimated timeframes for completing typical service connections needed for each housing development type. The bill was added to Division 4.1 of the Public Utilities Code and reads:

CHAPTER 9. Electrical, Gas, Sewer, and Water Service for New Housing Construction 8400. As used in this chapter, "utility" means any of the following that furnish electrical, gas, water, or sewer service, or any combination thereof, where the service is performed for, or the commodity is delivered to, the public or any portion thereof:

- (a) An electrical corporation, as defined in Section 218.
- 8401. (a) On or before January 1, 2026, for new housing construction, each utility shall publicly post both of the following on its internet website:
- (1) A schedule of estimated fees for typical service connections for each housing development type, including, but not limited to, accessory dwelling unit, multifamily, mixed-use, and single-family developments. This paragraph does not apply to a utility that continues to post a schedule of their fees with this information pursuant to Section 65940.1 of the Government Code.
- (2) The estimated timeframes for completing typical service connections needed for each housing development type, including, but not limited to, accessory dwelling unit, mixeduse, multifamily, and single-family developments.
- (b) (1) This section does not apply to a utility with fewer than 4,000 service connections that does not establish or maintain an internet website due to a hardship.

(2) The utility may establish that a hardship exists by annually adopting a resolution that includes detailed findings based on evidence that is publicly noticed before the meeting and included in the meeting agenda that supports the determination that a hardship prevents the utility from establishing or maintaining an internet website. The findings may include, but shall not be limited to, inadequate access to broadband communications network facilities that enable high-speed internet access, significantly limited financial resources, or insufficient staff resources.

SEC. 2. No reimbursement is required by this act pursuant to Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution because a local agency or school district has the authority to levy service charges, fees, or assessments sufficient to pay for the program or level of service mandated by this act, within the meaning of Section 17556 of the Government Code.

COMPLIANCE

BVES plans to implement SB 1210 bill requirements by adding additional information regarding the estimated fees and timeframes associated with new service connections to its website by January 1, 2026. A draft of the information that BVES will be providing on its website is attached to this advice letter as Attachment A. This information-only advice letter is being filed by November 3, 2025, in compliance with the request made by Energy Division on October 6, 2025, via email.

TIER DESIGNATION

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

EFFECTIVE DATE

BVES respectfully requests this advice letter become effective January 1, 2026.

NOTICE AND PROTESTS

A protest is a document objecting to the granting in whole or in part of the authority sought in this advice letter. A response is a document that does not object to the authority sought, but nevertheless presents information that the party tendering the response believes would be useful to the Commission in acting on the request.

A protest must be mailed within 20 days of the date the Commission accepts the advice letter for submission. The Calendar is available on the Commission's website at www.cpuc.ca.gov.

A protest must state the facts constituting the grounds for the protest, the effect that approval of the advice letter might have on the protestant, and the reasons the protestant believes the advice letter, or a part of it, is not justified. If the protest requests an evidentiary hearing, the protest must state the facts the protestant would present at an evidentiary hearing to support its request for whole or partial denial of the advice letter.

The utility must respond to a protest within five days.

New Construction Service Connection Schedule and Fees

Preliminary Service Request Process:

A Preliminary Service Request (PSR) must be submitted to Bear Valley Electric Service, Incorporated (BVES, Inc.) for New Construction & Services, Panel Upgrades & Relocations, Temporary Service, and Solar Installations.

Allow 3 to 6 weeks for Engineering to review any and all documents/plans pertaining to new construction, work orders and/or design. The review process will be delayed if all required documents are not received. If designs are required, please allow up to a minimum of 4 weeks additional for the Engineer to complete.

Visit the Construction page on BVES, Inc.'s website for BVES, Inc. specifications and standards.

New Construction Requirements:

- Set of approved building plans
- A bona-fide load schedule, preferably on building plans
- A copy of the approved construction permit
- A Cutsheet of the panel and or Switchgear to be utilized in the construction
- Construction schedule and equipment lead-time
- Must be received by BVES, Inc. Engineering prior to Final (permanent service)

New Housing Development Electric Service Connection Fees:

All prices are approximate and may be adjusted depending on labor costs, electrical requirements, or other specific needs such as permitting. Estimated cost will be confirmed by the assigned planner of a given project. Upon project completion, the assigned planner will review final project cost and determine if a customer owes an additional balance or provide a refund amount to be returned to the customer.

Services in unusual locations or in newly developed areas may require an extension of distribution infrastructure in addition to installing new service wire. Examples include erecting additional poles or setting a new transformer for a customer. Please refer to Rule 15 for additional information. Pricing for these services may be included in the connection schedule in accordance with Rule 16, and may result in variance from the estimates below.

- Services <100 feet from existing distribution infrastructure: \$0
- Overhead Services 100-200 feet from existing distribution infrastructure: \$253
- Underground Services 100-200 feet from existing distribution infrastructure: \$1,002
- Services requiring a dedicated pole set: \$5,921



New Construction Service Connection Schedule and Fees

• Services requiring a dedicated transformer: \$10,172

For a customer requesting service significantly outside BVES, Inc. distribution lines but within the service area, pricing may vary significantly or require additional contracted terms. Exact requirements will be discussed depending on specifics requested and may have unique requirements.

New Electric Service Interconnection Timeline:

Prior to the scheduling of interconnection to the BVES, Inc. electrical distribution system, the following conditions must be met:

- Any or all charges must be pre-paid by the Applicant to BVES
- Electrical service release must be approved by appropriate government agency
- Timelines will not start until customer electrical equipment panel/switchgear installation meets BVES inspection standards

Upon completion of above requirements, BVES, Inc. will schedule an interconnection as soon as possible but could take up to 1-3 weeks due to weather and/or other limitations. If projects need long lead-time equipment, materials, and/or require permitting, interconnection may be delayed subject to factors outside of BVES, Inc. control.
