Bear Valley Electric Service, Inc. ("BVES") hereby transmits for filing the following:

SUBJECT: *Tariff Updates to Implement California Climate Credit Timing Requirements Adopted in Decision 26-04-036*

PURPOSE

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph ("OP") 2 of California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision (D.) 26-04-036, BVES submits this Tier 1 Advice Letter to update its tariffs to reflect the revised schedule for distribution of the California Climate Credit to residential electric customers.

BACKGROUND

Ordering Paragraph 2 of D.26-04-036 requires Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric), LLC, Bear Valley Electric Service, Inc., and PacifiCorp to modify the timing of the residential electric Climate Credit as follows:

- The 2026 residential electric Climate Credit must be distributed in November 2026 instead of October 2026.
- Beginning in 2027 and continuing unless otherwise directed, the residential electric Climate Credit must be distributed in both October and November each year.
- Each utility must file a Tier 1 Advice Letter within 30 days of the effective date of the decision¹ to update its tariffs accordingly.
- If a utility determines that no tariff changes are necessary, it must instead serve notice of this determination to the Energy Division within the same 30-day period.

COMPLIANCE

BVES has reviewed its currently effective tariffs and identified the sections pertaining to the California Climate Credit. The current language on the residential and small business rate schedules state:

¹ Decision 26-04-036 issued 5/1/2026

California Climate Credit: A semi-annual credit from the State of California to fight climate change. This credit will be applied to each household billing statements of customers receiving service under this schedule at the time the California Climate Credit is disbursed. Any California Climate Credit not consumed in the billing period in which the credit is applied will roll over to each subsequent billing period until the credit is fully consumed.²

The language above is consistent with the directives of D.26-04-036 and maintain alignment with statewide Climate Credit administration.

Revised tariff sheets are included with this filing and are listed below:

- Preliminary Statement, Part WW: Greenhouse Gas Allowance Revenue Balancing Account

The language in the preliminary statement has been revised to be consistent with OP No. 5. If the Commission determines that additional modifications are necessary, BVES will promptly make any required updates.

TIER DESIGNATION

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

EFFECTIVE DATE

BVES respectfully requests this advice letter to become effective June 1, 2026.

NOTICE AND PROTESTS

A protest is a document objecting to the granting in whole or in part of the authority sought in this advice letter. A response is a document that does not object to the authority sought, but nevertheless presents information that the party tendering the response believes would be useful to the Commission in acting on the request.

A protest must be mailed within 20 days of the date the Commission accepts the advice letter for submission. The Calendar is available on the Commission's website at www.cpuc.ca.gov.

A protest must state the facts constituting the grounds for the protest, the effect that approval of the advice letter might have on the protestant, and the reasons the protestant believes the advice letter, or a part of it, is not justified. If the protest requests an evidentiary hearing, the protest must state the facts the protestant would present at an evidentiary hearing to support its request for whole or partial denial of the advice letter.

PRELIMINARY STATEMENTS

Part WW. Greenhouse Gas Allowance Revenue Balancing Account

A. Purpose

The purpose of the Greenhouse Gas ("GHG") Allowance Revenue Balancing Account ("GHGARBA") is to track and defer revenues from the sale of GHG allowances for subsequent allocation to eligible customer classes. The GHGARBA will record the amount of GHG revenues actually returned to customers, and the actual amount of GHG revenues BVES receives through consigning allowances to the cap-and-invest auction. (T)
GHGARBA is established pursuant to Decision No. 21-08-026 and D.26-04-036. (T)

B. Procedure

The Utility will:

1. Record the revenues from sales of GHG allowance sold via the cap-and-invest program auctions. (T)
2. Remit to Treasury 5% of any allowance revenues received, including interest, within 15 days of final receipt of total allowance revenues from that auction held between July 1, 2026 and July 1, 2031 pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 5 of D.26-04-036. (N)

3. Record disbursement issued Climate Credit to customers.
4. Monthly interest on the balancing account will accrue at 1/12 of the interest rate on 3-month Commercial Paper for the previous month, as published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 or its successor publication.

C. Allocation

Upon declaration by the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC") that the GHG allocation methodology is ready for implementation, BVES may begin to allocate allowance revenues recorded in the GHGARBA to eligible customer classes. The outstanding balance in the GHGARBA, including accrued interest, must be amortized over a reasonable period so that all deferred revenues are distributed within 24 months.

1. California Climate Credit
Beginning in April 2022, BVES will issue a California Climate Credit in compliance with CPUC Decision No. 21-08-026. The purpose is to return to eligible customers revenues generated from the sale of greenhouse gas emissions allowances (permits) required as part of California's Cap-and-Invest Program for greenhouse gas emissions which was developed in response to the California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006 (AB-32).
