Golden State Water Company ("GSWC") hereby transmits for filing an original and two copies of the following applicable to its Bear Valley Electric Service ("BVES") Division:

SUBJECT: <u>BVES Transportation Electrification Programs Safety Attestation in compliance</u> <u>with Decision No.18-09-034.</u>

PURPOSE

Pursuant to Decision No. ("D.") 18-09-034, BVES is submitting to the California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission" or "CPUC") its attestation letter detailing its efforts to comply with Safety Requirements Checklist for its priority review and standard review projects.

This Advice Letter ("AL") is in compliance with D.18-09-034 Ordering Paragraph No. ("OP") 20.

BACKGROUND

On June 30, 2017, BVES submitted its Application No. ("A.") 17-06-034, which was subsequently consolidated under A.17-06-031, in accordance with the September 14, 2016 Assigned Commission's Ruling Regarding the Filing of Transportation Electrification Applications

In its application, BVES proposed two complementary pilot programs that are designed to accelerate widespread Transportation Electrification ("TE") by reducing barriers that preclude EV travel over long distances and mountainous terrain and to reduce EV charging costs.

On September 27, 2018, the Commission issued D.18-09-034, which resolved the consolidated applications under A.17-06-031 and adopted BVES' 2017 Transportation Electrification Programs. The purpose and intent of D.18-09-034 is to implement the provisions of Senate Bill 350, the Clean Energy and Pollution Reduction Act, which establishes and promotes new clean energy, clean air, and greenhouse gas reduction goals for California for 2030 and beyond. As part of the D.18-09-034, BVES is to submit via advice letter an attestation signed by the project manager describing BVES's efforts

to comply with safety requirements and standards set forth by the Commission ¹(http://www.cpuc.ca.gov/sb350te/)².

D.18-09-034, OP 20 state:

20. No later than 18 months after the effective date of today's decision, the sponsoring utility for each priority review and standard review project must file a Tier 1 Advice Letter containing an attestation signed by the Project Manager describing their efforts to comply with the Safety Requirements checklist made available at http://www.cpuc.ca.gov/sb350te/. The sponsoring utility must maintain all compliance documentation available should the Commission determine an inspection or audit is necessary.

BVES TRANSPORTATION ELECTRIFICATION

In D.18-09-034, the Commission approved two programs for BVES. A priority review program and one standard review program.

BVES priority review program: Destination Make-Ready Rebate Pilot. This program would provide installation rebates for up to 50 Level 2 ("L2") charging stations to commercial customers in the BVES service territory, in addition to providing a complementary EV- TOU rate.

BVES standard review program: EV-TOU Pilot Rate Program. This program involves the installation of sub-meters in existing Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment ("EVSE") in order to apply separate TOU rates for EV charging. Both programs will contribute to the reduction of Greenhouse Gas emissions, improve local air quality, and address the current lack of EV charging infrastructure in BVES' service territory. The Commission approved BVES's rates in AL 354-E.

BVES has taken steps to ensure compliance with safety requirements. These steps include but are not limited to:

- Ensure all equipment and infrastructure will comply with standards and certifications.
- Non-standard equipment may be tested to meet compliance.
- Construction work to be performed by licensed and qualified contractors

Bear Valley Electric Company hereby attests that BVES has complied with the applicable elements of the Safety Requirements Checklist for its Transportation Electrification programs approved in D.18-09-034¹. BVES's efforts to comply with the Safety Requirements Checklist include, but are not limited, to the items below.

Pre-construction

- Standard charging equipment complies with NRTL & UL certification requirements.
- Some non-standard equipment may be field tested to meet the NRTL requirements.
- Infrastructure is designed in accordance with all applicable codes and AHJspecific requirements, including standards and requirements for outdoor charging applications.
- EVSE complies with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements, where applicable and comply with the California Building Code Chapter 11B,² if applicable.

During Construction

- All electrical infrastructure work is performed by licensed electricians with Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Training Program (EVITP) certification.
- Infrastructure designed in accordance with all applicable codes and applicable AHJ requirements. Contractors must provide load calculations to ensure existing load can accommodate additional EV load. Installations to be designed per Article 625 of the California electrical load.

Operational Safety

• Overcurrent protection, where required, is designed into the electrical infrastructure. All switch gear must meet EUSERC standards.
