Advice Letter No. 262-E

(U 913 E)

California Public Utilities Commission

Golden State Water Company ("GSWC") hereby transmits for filing an original and four copies of this Advice Letter on behalf of its Bear Valley Electric Service (BVES) Division:

SUBJECT

Unspent 2009-2011 Energy Savings Assistance ("ESA") Program Funds.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this advice letter is to request authority to spend unspent 2009 - 2011 ESA program funds in the 2012 - 2014 program cycle. BVES estimates that it will have approximately \$390,000 of unspent ESA program funds to roll-over into the 2012 program cycle.

BACKGROUND

On June 15, 2011, BVES submitted Application No. ("A") 11-06-018 ("Application") for approval of its Energy Savings Assistance (ESA) and California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) plans and budgets for program years 2012 through 2014. In its Application, BVES requests an annual ESA budget of \$229,625, which is the same as the budget approved in D.08-12-019; thus there would be no change in the monthly surcharge currently in rates for this program. In A.11-06-018, BVES identified that it had fallen behind in meeting its program cycle goal. On page 7 of the Application, BVES stated that for reasons relating to the execution of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) weatherization programs, its implementation contractor was having problems meeting the goals of utilities sponsored programs, including the BVES ESA program. The Application describes a catch-up plan that is in effect in 2011. While the catch-up plan was helpful, the program did not achieve its goals, as planned, and there will be funds carried over into 2012. Therefore, in accordance with D.08-12-019 (at pages 35 and 36), BVES will carry-over all under-spent funds into 2012. This is estimated to be approximately \$390,000. While it is clear from D.08-12-019 that BVES is

required to carry-over under-spent funds into the next program year, it is not clear that it has authority to spend these funds.

Currently, its implementation contractor has approximately 50 homes ready to complete but due to weather and some issues relating to obtaining refrigerators, the contractor does not expect to complete the work by the end of 2011. Almost all of these homes include refrigerator replacement. The cost of treating the homes is estimated to be between \$50,000 and \$75,000. In D.11-11-009, BVES was authorized a monthly bridge funding budget of \$19,135. If these homes are completed in January of 2012, the cost of treating the homes will exceed the \$19,135 monthly authorized budget. In addition, the implementation contractor and BVES believe that it can still catch-up in the first half of 2012. Therefore, BVES requests the following authority:

- 1) Complete the 50 homes that are ready to be serviced in 2012, using funds from the 2009 2011 program cycle; and/or
- 2) Continue its 2011 program into 2012, in parallel with its program authorized under D.11-11-009.

This Advice Letter is filed as a Tier 1 advice letter.

EFFECTIVE DATE

BVES requests the Commission make the changes to be the effective date January 1, 2012

NOTICE AND PROTESTS

A protest is a document objecting to the granting in whole or in part of the authority sought in this advice letter.

A response is a document that does not object to the authority sought, but nevertheless presents information that the party tendering the response believes would be useful to the CPUC in acting on the request.

A protest must be mailed within 20 days of the date the CPUC accepts the advice letter for filing. The Calendar is available on the CPUC's website at www.cpuc.ca.gov.

A protest must state the facts constituting the grounds for the protest, the effect that approval of the advice letter might have on the protestant, and the reasons the protestant believes the advice letter, or a part of it, is not justified. If the protest requests an evidentiary hearing, the protest must state the facts the protestant would present at an evidentiary hearing to support its request for whole or partial denial of the advice letter. The utility must respond to a protest with five days.
